NAPLEX and MPJE First Time Pass Rates

The North American Pharmacist Licensure Examination (NAPLEX) and Multistate Pharmacy Jurisprudence Examination (MPJE) is offered by the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP) and required for all graduates of an accredited college or school of pharmacy to pass prior to state licensure. ACPE monitors each college or schools' performance on the NAPLEX as per the ACPE Policy & Procedures. SU COPHS's NAPLEX pass rates are summarized in the table below.
